

## **Campus Luigi Einaudi** 19-20 SEPTEMBER, KEYNOTE AND PARALLEL SESSIONS

The Luigi Einaudi Campus is located along the banks of the Dora river in the former Italgas industrial area, not far from the Mole Antonelliana. Designed by Norman Foster, one of the most important contemporary British architects, it was listed by CNN among the 10 most spectacular university buildings in the world. The Campus hosts the School of Juridical Political and Economic-Social Sciences and the Norberto Bobbio Library.



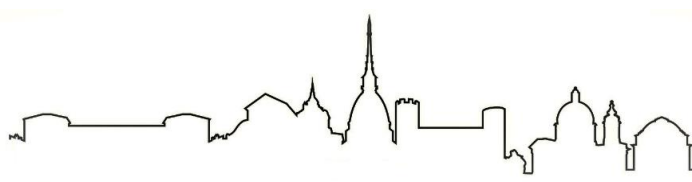

## How to reach the conference venue



The closest airports to the city of Torino are:

- the **international airport of Turin "Sandro Pertini"**, located in Caselle Torinese about 15 km from the city. The airport is connected to the city center by a shuttle service ([Sadem Bus Shuttle](#)) with stops at the Porta Nuova and Porta Susa railway stations. Travel time is approximately 45/50 minutes.
- **Milan Malpensa international airport**, about 140 km from Turin. The Malpensa airport is connected to the Turin center through a shuttle service ([Sadem Malpensa Express](#)) with stops at Porta Susa Railway Station and the Bus Terminal in C.so Vittorio Emanuele II 131 / H. SI make about ten connections a day and the journey time is about 2 hours.



Torino conected by the Highway Network with different exits: **Highway Torino-Milano (A4)** – with exit in Torino North; **Highway Torino-Piacenza (A21)** – with exit in Torino South.



By train, Turin can be reached from all major Italian cities by high-speed trains ([Trenitalia](#) or [Italo](#)). The main arrival stations are **Porta Nuova Railway Station** (C.so Vittorio Emanuele II 58) and **Porta Susa Railway Station** (Piazza 18 December 8). Both stations are connected to each other by the metro line
